Communications Director Report

The PhoneTree 2100, which was voted on and approved by the members at the business meeting, has arrived and is setup and fully functional. This tool will make it much easier for the Event Managers and other Directors to get the word out to the council in a very timely fashion, and eliminates the problem we were having with keeping the contact information synchronized between the Financial Secretary's database and the phone tree list. This is made possible because the PhoneTree 2100 software can directly import the membership roster that the FS keeps. The protocol for using the system is as follows: a request by an event manager/program director is sent to the Grand Knight for approval, and if it is approved, the information required is forwarded to the communications director, who will then install the voice message to be sent (either provided by the requester or recorded by the communications director from the request) and initiate the call out. A report of the success of the callout will be provided to the requester at the completion of the call out.

Please consider switching from receiving your copy of each month's KnightNews in the mail to downloading it from the

council website. Each copy that gets mailed out in paper form costs the council \$1.21 to \$1.41 depending on the number of pages. If you multiply that by the 140 or so copies each month that get mailed out, and the total becomes about \$200, and for the year \$2400. If you have an Internet connection, please consider it. The instructions on how to do it are on the council website. Also a quick note about the Jubilee Dinner/Dance — that was great! I had a really fun time playing the music for everyone to enjoy and it was great seeing everyone up on the dance floor having fun, especially the kids (I still keep hearing The Hamster Dance in my head) The food was fantastic and it seemed as though everyone was enjoying themselves. The speakers were really great and the book that Aaron and crew put together is priceless! Hope I'm here in another 50 years for the next one! Thanks.

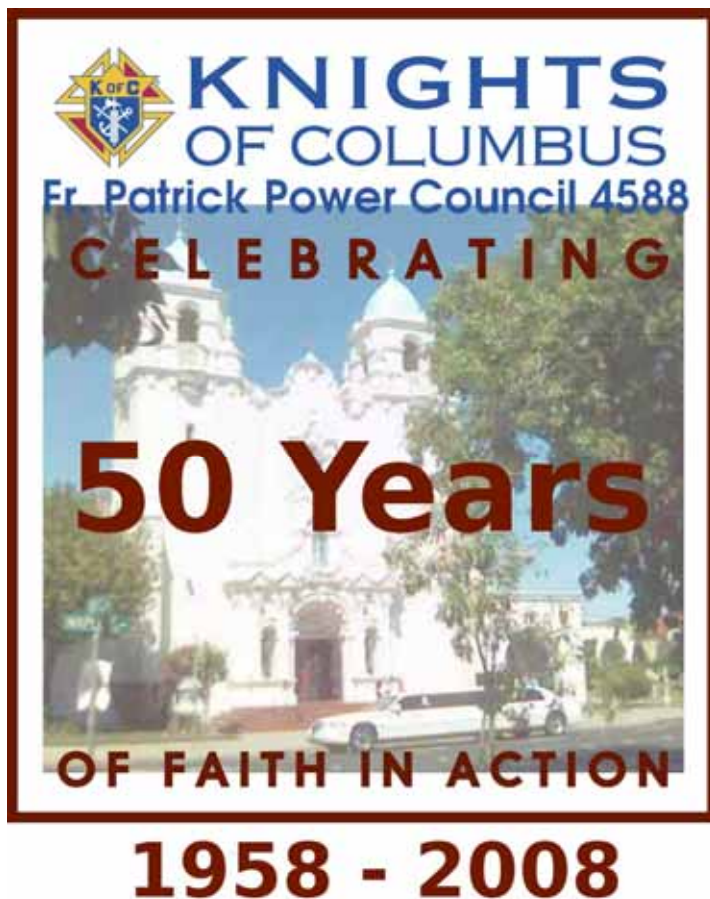
Thanks For The Memories

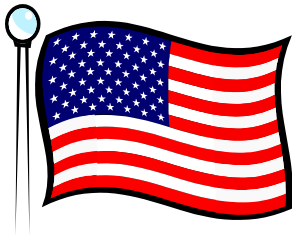
