Message from the Financial Secretary

Brother Knights,

Again we find ourselves at year's end and of course, we all know what that means. Yes, you guessed it – It's time for membership dues to be paid. Membership billing notices will be sent out on December 15th and payment will be due on January 1st, 2009. However, before I tell you what the membership assessment is for this next year, there are a couple of items to which I would like to direct your attention.

1. Last August, the Supreme Knight addressed the 2008 Annual Supreme Convention saying " Today we constantly hear about change. We must remember that real change means building a culture of life and a civilization of love." He continued, "We are a non-partisan organization, and Knights belong to a variety of political parties. We do not endorse candidates for public office, although many of our members are elected officials. But we do take a strong interest in certain critical issues that affect our most fundamental values as Catholic Christians and as citizens..... And if we truly hope for a Culture of Life and a Civilization of Love, then we must think, and then act, in new ways." In response to the Supreme Knight's call to action, the convention delegates unanimously voted and approved resolution #302 calling for the establishment of a Culture of Life Fund through a special mandatory assessment on the membership. The Board of Directors, at their quarterly meeting, then voted to establish this Culture of Life Fund and has therefore assessed our council \$3.00 per member (excluding Honorary and Honorary Life members). In this way, we can reaffirm the Order's Long standing commitment to building a culture of life by supporting the teaching of the Catholic Church in matters dealing with life, family, marriage, and similar priorities.
2. Another item that some of you may not be aware of is the "365 Club". The "365 Club" is composed of members of the Knights of Columbus in California that contribute a penny a day to California Columbian Charities, Inc. for the purpose of helping Brother Knights who are in financial distress. Knights can become a member by paying an additional \$3.65 as a voluntary assessment on top of your dues statement. So if your assessed dues are \$39.00 you can remit one payment to the council for \$42.65 and we will separate it appropriately. When the \$3.65 is paid, I, the Financial Secretary, will place a red 365 decal on your membership card to indicate that you are a member of the "365 Club". All of the donations to the "365 Club" are held by our council until May of each year when these funds are presented to the State Deputy during the Parade of the Grand Knights at the Annual Convention. Please consider this voluntary contribution.

So, having called your attention to these items, the dues for the 2009 calendar year are set at \$39.00 for regular associate and insurance members and \$10.00 for Honorary members – payable to Knights of Columbus Council 4588. For our regular associate and insurance members, this includes our normal dues of \$36.00 plus the \$3.00 Culture of Life Fund assessment. Any additional voluntary contributions you wish to make can all be included in the same remittance.

I want to remind you that promptly paying your dues is an important part of your membership obligation. If our council does not receive your payment in a timely manner, you will not be issued a current membership card. And, as you know, a current membership card is required for attendance and participation at all Knights of Columbus business meetings and ceremonial exemplifications. A "current" membership card is defined as one bearing a "Dues paid to" date equal to or greater than the current date. Without payment, our council will be forced to move you into suspension status and suspension for nonpayment of dues represents the largest and saddest group of losses to our Order each year. So, please pay your dues because each of you are a valued member of our council and your continued support of our organization is of great importance to us.

One last item I want to bring to your attention is our Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity Individual Worksheet attached below. Each of you receiving a membership bill will receive a copy of it and those of you who are not billed can cut out the one below. Please fill it out and return it to me before January 17th so we can get a council total for each item and submit our Fraternal Activity Report to Supreme by January 30th.

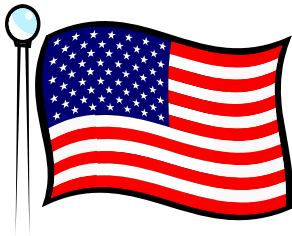
